Scope & Content / Abstract:

The collection has been lightly reorganized from 29 legal-size file folders on the history of Presbyterian mission in Brazil from 1859 till shortly after the reunion in 1983 which created the PC(USA). The material was gathered by and donated to the Presbyterian Heritage Center by Frank and Hope Arnold, missionaries (PCUS and PC(USA)) from 1963-1996. Frank was Area Associate for Latin America and the Caribbean from 1977-1979 and General Secretary of the Brazil Mission from 1980-1985. The material was used in the preparation of Frank's book, "Long Road to Obsolescence," published in English in 2009 and in Portuguese in 2012. All folder-level descriptions originated with Frank Arnold. (June 5, 2012)

Collection includes notes, documents, and mission reports related to Brazil, Martha Little, and Brazil missionaries.

 Administrative / Biographical history: Frank Leonard Arnold was born on May 12, 1931 in Philadelphia, PA to Frank J. and Minnie L. Schmidt Arnold. He married Hope A. Hoft of Wall Lake, Iowa on September 1, 1956. He attended Pennsylvania State College (now University) from 1949-53 for a B.S., then Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia from 1956-59 for a B.D. He was ordained July 22, 1962, and became a missionary to Brazil in 1963.

Abigail Hope Abigail Arnold, 86 of Stone Mountain Georgia died April 2, 2020 at Sunrise of Five Forks' Reminiscence facility. She was born October 20th, 1933 in Carroll, Iowa, daughter of the late Henry and Beulah Hoft. Hope was next to the youngest of seven siblings. Immediately after high school Hope spent a year at Iowa State University and then went on to the nursing school at Presbyterian Hospital in Philadelphia where she graduated in 1956 and in the same year married Frank L. Arnold of Philadelphia. Hope worked as an RN to help support them while Frank was in seminary. The first of their five children, David, was born during those three years. The couple then moved to Richmond, Virginia where they felt a strong calling from God to become missionaries of the Presbyterian Church. With their then three children (adding Deborah and John) the couple spent 33 happy, fruitful years in Brazil during which time two more sons, Daniel and Stephen were born.
