### *Biographical Information*

William Francis Junkin (1870-1947) was born on December 26, 1870 in New Providence, Virginia to Dr. Ebenezer Dickey and Agnes Anna Penick Junkin. He graduated from Austin College and then Louisville Theological Seminary, beginning as a missionary in China in 1896. He married Nettie Lambeth DuBose (born April 28, 1878 in Shanghai, China to Dr. and Mrs. Hampden Coit DuBose) on April 3, 1900 in Soochow, China. They had six children: Hampden (1902-1903), Nettie DuBose (1905-1986), Ebenezer Dickey (1908-1909), Agnes Penick *Junkin* Peery (1909-1996), William Francis (1913-1988), and Tinsley Penick (1914-1914).
