Biographical Information

Rev. C Charles Edward Raynal, Jr., 83, died Thursday evening, Sept. 17, 1998 at his residence, at the Presbyterian Home of S.C. where he was a retired Chaplain. (He served as Chaplain from 1977-1980).

A Memorial Service will be held 2 P.M. Saturday, Sept. 19, 1998 at The South Carolina Presbyterian Home Chapel, Summerville. Inurnment will be 2 P.M. Sunday at Fort Hill Presbyterian Church, Clemson, S.C.

Rev. Raynal was born May 6, 1915 in Statesville, N.C. a son of the late Charles Edward Raynal, Sr. and Margaret Mayo Scott Raynal. He graduated from Statesville, NC Schools, Davidson College and Union Theological Seminary.

Rev. Raynal served as a Captain (Chaplain's Corps) in the U.S. Navy during in the Pacific Theater. After returning from WWII, he served Churches throughout S.C. as a Presbyterian minister.

For 20 years he was a minister of Fort Hill Presbyterian, Clemson. He was a member of Charleston Atlantic Presbyterian Church, USA. Surviving are: his wife, Laetitia Hay Jones Raynal of Summerville; four sons, Rev. Charles E. Raynal, III of Davidson, NC, Dudley J.

PhD of Syracuse, NC, Holbrook W. Raynal, M.D. of Clinton, SC and Rev. Gordon W.G. Raynal of Inman, S.C.; one brother, Rev.

H.M. Raynal of Lexington, VA' and 7 grandchildren. Memorials to: Presbyterian Home of SC or charity of one's choice. James A. Dyal Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.
